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- The Crisis Management Innovation Network Europe
- CMINE facilitates Networking far more than just a platform.
- a product of Driver+ (concluded 2020),
- maintained under an initiating MoU,
- independent (not-for-profit) and
- currently involving 2000 + CM professionals









- Value Driven based entirely on the value its members perceive
- Still growing 4 years after closure of its initiating project
- Self-funded and resourced for at least a further 4 years
- Currently funded by: RESILOC, PEERS, DIREKTION, TeamAware, PARATUS, SYNERGIES & EMBRACE







- Seed-funded by Driver+ (approx. €60k)
- Self-sustaining: currently funded by 7 Horizon projects
- Embedded in future proposals (10 in 2024)
- Provided as a service (not-for-profit)
- Managed & Moderated by a small team of sector-relevant volunteers
- Non-competitive and designed to function as a discrete "Network of Networks" promoting other Networks/groups and agencies.







- Seen as 'safe hands' (not about to disappear with diminishing funding)
- Clustering initiatives encouraging:
  - shared resources
  - informal debate
  - event sharing
  - facilitation of a "thematic voice"

- Clusters for; CBRN, Standardisation, Responder Technology and Societal Resilience
- Facilitation (registration and management) of key events including Webinars & conferences (eg SMI2G)
- Hosting & signposting of legacy project outcomes such as deliverables, event records and knowledge bases


